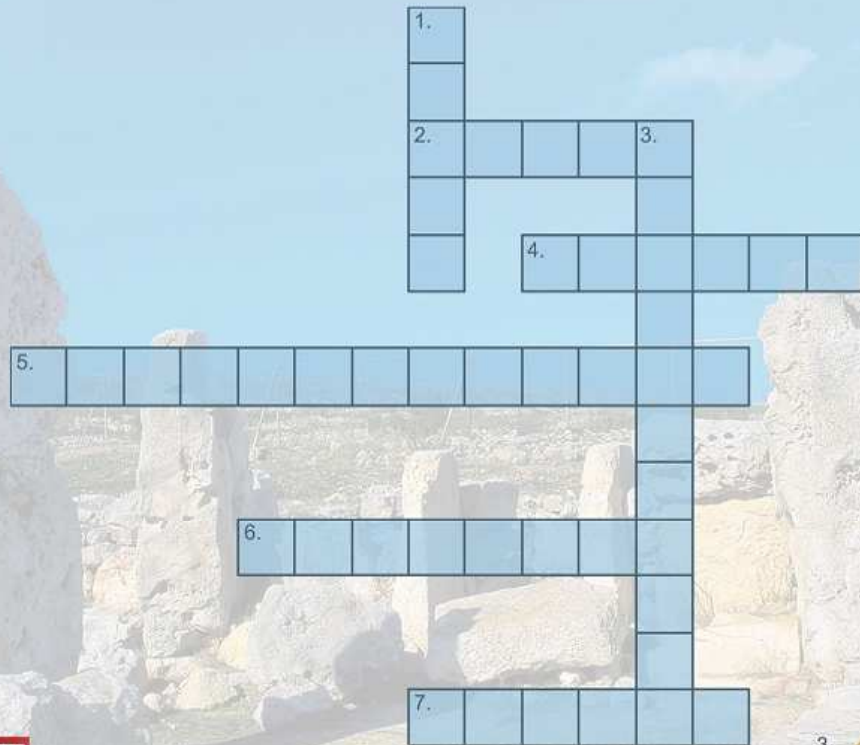


Archaeologist's Toolbox

Prehistoric Mġarr

Skorba Temples is the only site on the Maltese Islands where the remains of the houses of the temple builders can still be seen!

Ta' Ħaġrat Temples were discovered in 1917 and soon became well-known for the curious objects found during excavation.



Both sites are open on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday between 9am – 12pm (except on public holidays).

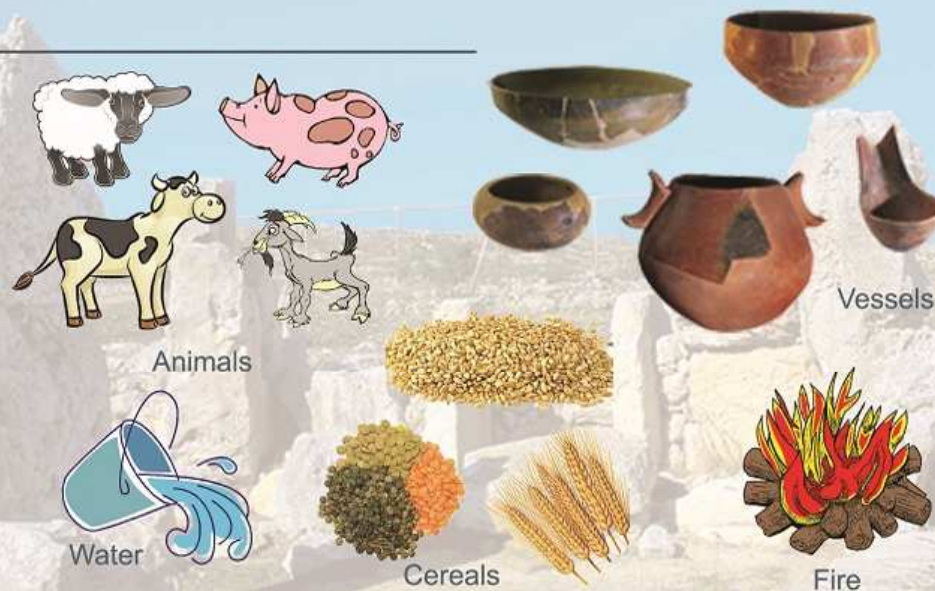
