

National Museum of Natural History

The museum is the national repository of biological specimens. The majority of the displays highlight the local biodiversity. Birds, insects and other fauna are presented along with geology and fossil displays. Other displays include exotic species such as large carnivores, apes and monkeys, and Australian mammals, fish, sharks, crabs, turtles and whale bones. The museum also holds over 1 million specimens in the reference collections.
