

Skorba

The site includes the remains of two temples and a number of domestic huts. Excavated in the 1960s, it was the first prehistoric temples site in Malta where modern dating techniques were used.

Opening Times: Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays between 09.00 and 16.30hrs. Due to the small size and fragility of this site, only **15 visitors** may be admitted at a time.

Closed: on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays. Also closed on the 24, 25 & 31 December, 1 January & Good Friday.

Tickets available Monday to Saturday from the Mġarr Local Council and Monday to Friday from Heritage Malta's Head Office in Kalkara.*
