

## The National War Museum - Fort St Elmo

The National War Museum houses a superb collection of artefacts that narrate the military history of the Maltese Islands from the early phases of the Bronze Age, around 2,500 B.C. (when the first inhabitants arrived from Sicily), to Malta's EU Accession in 2004. Perhaps the three most important artefacts on display are the **Gloster Sea Gladiator N5520 FAITH**, **Roosevelt's Jeep 'Husky'** and Malta award for gallantry, the **George Cross**.

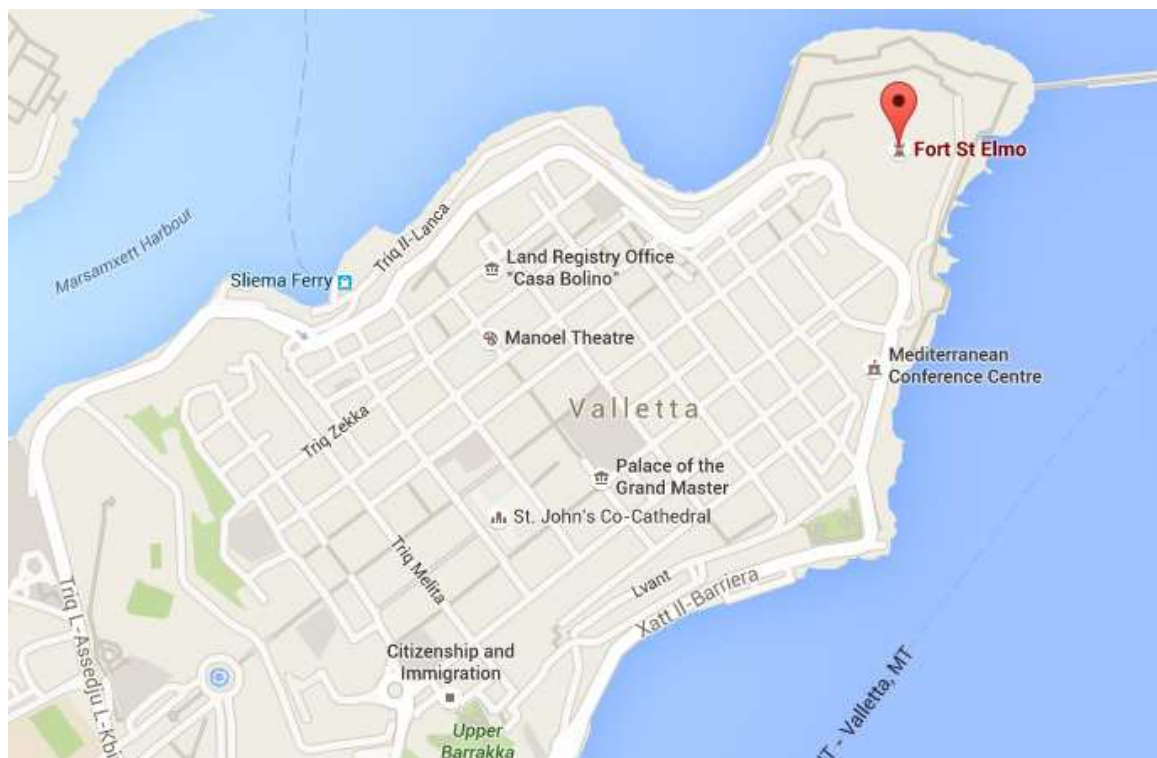
The museum is located within the fortified walls of **Fort St Elmo**. An attraction in itself, the fort offers outstanding views of the Grand Harbour and surrounding areas.

**Opening Times:** Monday to Sunday: **09.00 - 17.00hrs**. Last admission: 16.30hrs.

**Closed:** 24, 25 & 31 December, 1 January & Good Friday.
