

## The Palace State Rooms

The Palace was one of the very first buildings in the new city of Valletta founded by **Grand Master Jean Parisot de Valette** in **1566**. The Palace is nowadays the seat of the **Office of the President of the Republic**. The State Rooms include the impressive **Tapestry Chamber**, the **Throne Room**, and the **corridors**, which display the glory of the Order of St John.

**Opening Times:** Monday to Friday (closed every Thursday) between 10.00 and 16.30hrs (last admission at 16.00hrs) and Saturday and Sunday between 09.00 and 16.30hrs (last admission at 16.00hrs).

**Closed:** Every **Thursday**, 24, 25 & 31 December, 1 January & Good Friday. The Palace may also be closed to visitors at short notice due to the exigencies of the Office of the President.

**Tickets:** Adults (18-59 years): **€8.00**/ Youths, Students & Seniors: **€6.00**/ Children (6-11 years): **€4.00**/ Infants (1-5 years): **Free**. Tickets include admission to Armoury.
